Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2015/16

- Achievement for All further 8 focus pupils to improve lit/num/memory skills and parents
- Forest Schools Programme 38 pupils Focus: improved attitude to learning/self esteem
- Y2 Class stand alone class and teacher supporting 12 pupils
- RWI initiative supporting 41 pupils in EYFS and pupils across KS1
- Residentials/School Camp/Educational Trips Supporting 31 pupils in accessing curriculum enrichment opportunities

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

The school evaluated the impact on each pupil at the end of each term. Evaluation focussed on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a consequence of the intervention.

24 x PP pupils supported in KS2 of which 13 (54%) were also on the school SEN record of need:

KS2 2016 71% PP pupils working at or above in RWM

All KS2: Reading PP pupils 76% working at or above

Writing PP pupils 43% working at or above

Maths PP pupils 57% working at or above

12 x PP children supported in EYFS/KS1 of which 8 (66%) were also on the school SEN record of need

7 x KS1 pupils accessed RWI initiative of which 4 were also SEN (57%)

KS1 2016 (2020 cohort) 75% PP pupils working at or above in RWM

14 x KS2 pupils accessed the 5 day residential to Okehampton

6 x KS2 pupils accessed the 2 day residential to Camp Kernow
