Speaking and listening:

"There's evidence that teaching pupils to develop their **spoken** ability supports the development of their writing skills. ... Other studies have shown that developing oracy skills helps to retain subject-specific knowledge. It is right that **speaking and listening** should underpin the curriculum in all subjects."

There are obviously huge links in speaking and listening and promoting positive mental health and the ability to express feelings, emotions and generally develop relationships. We need to focus on these skills as it is high-priority on the Literacy Development Plan for St Erth.
