Red Nose Day


The children had fun today supporting the Red Nose Day appeal. We raised £70. Thank you for your support.



Current Coronavirus Guidance

Following the updates to government guidance through the living with Covid-19 plan announced on February 24th, Parents need to be aware of the following, this is also reflected in the school's risk assessment. Full details can be found at <https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/covid-19-people-with-covid-19-and-their-contacts/covid-19-people-with-covid-19-and-their-contacts>

- Anyone with a new or continuous cough, a high temperature, a loss of, or change to, your normal sense of taste and smell, should order a PCR test and are advised to stay at home whilst awaiting results.
- Other symptoms linked to Covid -19 include: shortness of breath, fatigue, loss of appetite, muscle ache, sore throat, headache, stuffy or runny nose, diarrhoea, nausea and vomiting. Any of these symptoms may have another cause.
- Anyone with a positive LFD test is also advised to stay at home and order a PCR test, even if not displaying symptoms.
- The most effective way of avoiding passing on Covid-19 infection remains to stay at home and avoid contact with other people. If you have Covid-19 you should stay at home.
- Below is a flow chart showing how LFD tests can allow individuals to end isolation early
