School Admissions September 2021

The online application system for applications to our Reception class for next September (this will be for children born between 01 September 2016 and 31 August 2017) closes today.

A couple of reminders - Don't forget that it is still important to notify us if your child has been in school and develops any of the following symptoms: a new continuous cough, a high temperature or a loss or change to taste or smell. You will also need to arrange a Covid-19 test as soon as possible and inform us of the result as soon as you receive it.

Emergency procedures remain in place should the school be forced to close entirely. If we know we won't be able to open the following day, we will notify the Council who in turn notify local radio stations. So if your child is due to come into school and the weather is bad please listen to Radio Cornwall, Goldmine FM, Heart FM or Pirate FM. We will also send an email, a notice via SeeSaw & one of our Governors will be at the gate in case you miss the announcements. If we are already in school the above will also happen but once we have sent messages, we will then start to telephone parents to ensure you have seen the message and are on your way to collect your children.
