FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND PUPIL PREMIUM

Do you think your circumstances might entitle you to free school meals for your child? Even if they already receive Universal Infant Free School Meals because they are in Year 2 or below, please make an application as this will also entitle your child to Pupil Premium funding. This extra funding will last for at least 6 years, regardless of changes to your circumstances, and will provide extra money for the school to use to support your child and also some money for you to allocate for trips, etc, as you see fit. If you think you might be eligible please make an application this weekend online at:

If you have an older child that is already entitled to free school meals and another that has just started school you will need to make an application for the Reception child as entitlement is not automatically applied to siblings.

Newsletter via email

Forms - please make sure that all forms are signed and returned to school by Monday, especially data checking sheets, visit consent forms and any health forms for Reception and Year 6 if you wish to opt your child out of health checks.

DEBTS

Debts this week total £357. A portion of these relates to school meals. Please remember that all school meals should be paid for in advance or on the day the meal is taken. A reminder to Year 3 children parents that Universal Free School Meals only applies up to Year 2 so if your child has just gone into Year 3 any meals taken this term need to be paid for.



Our Breakfast Club starts at 8 am each morning if you need to get to work early.. It costs £2.00 per

session and there's no need to book unless your child needs a breakfast as well as childcare. In this case we do need to know the day before and breakfast costs an extra £1 per day. The club is free for those in receipt of Pupil Premium funding.

PLEASE REMEMBER THAT IF YOU USE THE BREAKFAST CLUB, FOR SAFETY REASONS, WE ASK THAT YOU BRING YOUR CHILD INTO THE CLUB. IN PERSON, USING THE SIDE DOOR.

If you have not yet sent in your child's cookery club money please can you do this on Monday as we rely on this to purchase ingredients for the things they make. It costs £10 for the term.

Head Bumps
